Trust Badge Policy

(Updated October 2018)

Core Value:

We at St Luke's nurture and believe a culture of 'Trust' is our priority for behaviour expectation. Trust is nurtured and agreed through consultation and discussion with staff, pupils and parents. Our wide and varied programme of behaviour and emotional support contributes to the creation of our core value. This support includes community building, circle time, the solution focussed approach along with an active student council and Rights Respecting Schools.

Procedure:

- All pupils in Key Stage 2 will be given a school Trust Badge to wear at all times. Distribution will be on entry into Year 3 in September. If a student loses or misplaces their badge, it will be their responsibility to purchase a replacement from the school office.
- Year 6 are provided with a red Trust Badge identifying them as those that have proven themselves trustworthy the longest.
- Any Badge removed from a pupil will be for 5 school days for whatever reason.
- Parents will always be informed of any trust badge loss which is considered a serious occurrence.
- All badges removed will be kept by the Headteacher/Deputy Headteacher and recorded on the "Trust Badge Log".
- 5 Day removal begins when the badge is removed (or handed over if not being worn at that point).
- If a Badge has already been removed and another incident occurs, this will be added to the first five day removal.
- If continued Badge Loss occurs, a meeting will be set up with the Deputy Head/Phase Leader, class teacher and parents/carers. There may be occasions when the Headteacher/SENDSCO are also involved.

Example Behaviours Resulting In Badge Loss:

- General behaviours in and around classrooms and school where staff feel 'Trust' has been significantly compromised.
- Lack of respect for any member of staff.
- Lack of respect for the school and other's property.
- Taunting and teasing other pupils.
- Swearing, use of bad language.
- Repeated low level disruption.

Consequences Of Trust Badge Loss:

(Loss of Badge Means Loss of Privileges!!)

- No soft surface at playtime / lunchtime.
- No football/Netball at playtime / lunchtime.
- No extracurricular activities.
- Not allowed to 'represent' St Luke's School.
- No library use at playtimes/Lunchtimes.

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- No trips out (at the teacher's discretion).

The following will result; not only in Trust Badge removal, but a meeting will be set up with the Head/Deputy Head/Phase Leader, class teacher and parents/carers which may result in more rigorous sanctions.

- Extremely violent and aggressive behaviour – physical or verbal.
- Bullying (including online bullying).

'Bullying' is defined as something where someone or a group of people pick on, put down or hurt others through repeated verbal, physical, social or psychological aggressive behaviour.
