Maths:

Space shape and Measure: We are going to revisit 3D shapes and as we prepare for our Christmas Fayre on Friday, children will be looking at wrapped presents in the shapes of cylinders, cubes, cuboids, pyramids and spheres and trying to guess what's inside!

Literacy:
