After Half Term in Year 1

Maths:

We will be looking at numbers up to 20 focusing in particular on numbers between 10 and 20. Pupils will be able count and write to 20, compare and order numbers, and see patterns within 20. The children will also be looking at range of strategies to solve problems like the one below:



English:

Reading

We will be beginning our new literacy topic of Fairy stories and traditional tales. Therefore we will begin by exploring traditional tales by reading them as a class. We will be looking at 'The Enormous Turnip' and 'The Three Little Pigs'. We will be practising the skills of prediction and identifying characters and events.

Writing

The skills we will be practising in writing will be:

- Writing a dictated sentence using capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.
- Beginning to look at the suffixes 'ing' and 'ed' and using these in our writing.
- Writing our own version of 'The Three Little Pigs'.

Home Learning Activities:

***Please ensure that all homework is completed each week and homework books are in your child's book bag on a Monday to allow me to mark, add new homework and return the book to you by Tuesday.

Daily Reading - We have collected in the reading books over half term so please ensure that you are reading books from home over the holidays or even take a visit or two to the library. If your child has moved to a new reading level (please see reading record book) they will begin reading at this level after the holidays.

Half Term Homework: There are no spellings for over the half term - instead you will see that I have included reading comprehension homework. Please ask your child to read the short story at the top and then answer the related questions in full sentences please.
