## Next week in Reception

### Maths:

We will be applying our representation of number in practical contexts. During self-registration, please encourage your child to add a Lego piece to the tower next to the book that they would like to share at the end of the day. We will count the blocks together and the tower with the most blocks will dictate the book that is chosen.

### Literacy:

Following on from our shared writing of shopping lists this week, children will be given note books and food magazines to write their own shopping lists should they choose to do so. In Phonics we continue to write three/four letter words, encouraging increasing independence from the children at this point.

### Home Learning Activities:

• Following on from our work this week in class looking at 1p, 5p and 2p coins, homework is to:

Set up a pretend shop at home. Label objects such as an orange, a toy, a hairbrush, a pencil etc. with price tags saying 1p, 2p or 5p. Provide children with the relevant coins. You can take turns being the shop keeper and customer and pay using the correct coin.



Please read: your child's reading book, library book and any books taken from the lending library. Letter sounds and number cards are in book bags to practise with.
