Next Week in Year 4

Maths:

In Maths, we will be spending a second week looking at the topic of **time**. We will continue to learn about:

- Telling the time using a twelve and twenty four hour clock.
- Changing time in minutes to seconds. Hours to minutes and months to years.
- Finding duration, start and finish times.
- Solving problems involving time.

English:

After half-term, in **Writing** we will be launching 'Text Drivers,' linking our work in Literacy to relevant Foundation subjects such as History, Science and Geography. In Year 4, we will be looking at several books which deal with The Roman Invasion and the story of Boudicca.

In **Reading**, we will be exploring chapters 14 - 16 of **James and the Giant Peach** by Roald Dahl, with associated writing tasks.

Home Learning Activities:

Homework is set on a Tuesday due in the Monday of the following week.

Maths:

This week's maths task is focused on time. Children are to complete the worksheet provided.

Spellings:

Children are to learn the following ten words for testing next week: *accidentally, caught, early, grammar, imagine, build, different, famous, height, knowledge.*

I have left it to the children to decide currently their preferred way of learning these.

Reading:

Please try to read every night for 15 minutes and record it in your reading diary. These need to be given in alongside homework books on Monday.

Times Tables:

Please practice your 4 and 5 times tables at home this week.
