Next week in Year 2...

Maths:

Next week we will be moving onto fractions! We will be looking at making equal parts, showing half, quarters and thirds as well as naming fractions.

English:

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar: we will be looking at connectives to make our stories flow.
Handwriting: we will be looking at the igh join.
Literacy: Our focus for our writing will be the story of Dragon Stew. The children have planned their new endings, put these onto a story board and will be beginning to write them up properly.

Home Learning Activities:

Homework is set on a Tuesday due in the Monday of the following week. This week's tasks are:

- **Spellings** - please can the children have a go at putting their spellings into sentences, this is to show that they understand what the word means. Spellings will be tested on Mondays.
- **Reading:** The children will be taking new reading books home once a week, please make sure they have their books in their bags every day. Please read with your child for 15 minutes each night.
- **Maths:** This week's maths homework is focused on 3D shapes. The children have been asked to find 3D shapes around their homes and to identify the faces on 3D shapes.
- There are **home reader books** available for you to borrow from just inside the classroom, please help yourself and let me know if you have taken one.

Children's books cannot be changed if they do not bring their old book and reading diary in with them. This is to ensure that we keep full sets of books together at school. A reminder that reading books will be changed on a Friday, please ensure that both book and diary are in school on this day.

Dates for the diary:

P.E days will be on **Tuesdays** and **Thursdays**. Please can children come to school wearing their P.E kit on these days? Thank you!

Waste Free Wednesdays
