- **Spellings:** I have assigned this week's spellings to the Year 2 section of the website; please find your child's group on the document- Group 1 or Group 2. I will try and set up an area on Seesaw next week to submit spelling tests to show me how your child has done... watch this space!
- **Learning Project:** This week the theme for the learning project is The Environment. If your child does any work related to this project I have made a learning tab for it on Seesaw, please feel free to attach any work related to the project on there.
- **PSHE:** The Right that children will learn this week is: 'Every child has the right to be registered at birth, to have a name and nationality, and, as far as possible, to know and be cared for by their parents'. Please go through the PowerPoint with your child- thank you.
