98% of our families agree that:

5.6% responded that their child has experienced bullying. More than half of these responded that they had raised it with school and things had improved.

Potentially due to school not being able to offer enrichment clubs last term (due to the industrial action). Hopefully with the re-introduction of clubs (currently on offer are Art&Craft, Cookery, Recorder, Ukelele, Choir, Drama, Football, Singing & academic booster groups) combined with Friends of St Luke fundraising events we will return to the 100% agreement fror last year.
