Children's access and use of IT



Parents say...

79% said the children access the internet in a room with the family & 21% use it in their bedroom.

100% said their children talk to them about what they are doing on the internet.

Children say...

100% use the internet at home

60% said they access the internet in a room with the family & 71% use it in their bedroom.

43% said they talk to their parents about what they are doing on the internet.

Parents say...

100% said their children had limits on how much screen time they had on weekdays.

80% said their children had limits on how much screen time they had at the weekend.

100% said they had set rules for what their children can access & do on the internet.

100% said they monitor what their child is accessing/doing online.

100% said their children **do not have permission** to access social media apps..

83% said their child knew about online safety.

Children say...

41% said they had limits on how much screen time they had on weekdays.

33% said they had limits on how much screen time they had on weekends.

57% said their parents had rules for using the internet.

48% said their parents monitored what they were doing online.

Social Media Apps that the children say they currently access:

- 32% Snapchat
- 33% TikTok
- 37% WhatsApp
- 11% Instagram
- 16% Facebook
 - 3% X
 - 4% BlueSky
- 64% something else not listed.

97% said they had learnt about online safety at school.
