





## Important message from the school Designated Safeguarding Leadership (DSL) Team

Dear parents and carers,

Please note, this communication is being sent to the parents of all students at St Luke's to ensure everyone is familiar with these important procedures.

All Government of Jersey schools are part of a safeguarding protocol that aims to improve outcomes for children and families affected by domestic abuse.

This scheme has been designed to provide early reporting to schools of any domestic abuse incidents that might have an impact on a child who is one of their students. The scheme is run in partnership between the Police, the Education Department, and all schools.

During the school term, I will receive a notification (in my capacity as Designated Safeguarding Lead) of any domestic abuse incident that has been reported to the police in relation to a household in which one of our children is known to live.

This reflects the fact that domestic abuse in a household can have a significant impact on children, even if they do not see what is happening.

Any information received through this protocol will be used to inform appropriate support to children who may be upset or worried by what has happened. The information will remain confidential, being shared on a strictly need-to-know basis with staff responsible for the children's welfare.

## Parent Survey 2025 - "You said, We did"

*As stated in our recently published Parental Survey 2025 results we will provide a newsletter standing item to provide you with more information, clarification and updates based on your feedback.*

**SEN** - "More awareness of neurodivergent learning" - Inclusion is a standing item on our School Improvement Plan (SIP) and is an area that we consider highly important. We have been working closely with The ADHD Foundation as well as buying in additional SEN training and support from Dr Graham Ramsden for the past couple of years (focussing on ADHD, Autism, Dyslexia & Executive Functioning). Our next Tri-School INSET staff training (22.4.25) is all about PDA - Pathological Demand Avoidance. We hold termly assemblies focussing on Neurodivergence & this month we held our first Neurodivergence day with all classes completing activities and a shared display in the hall.

We have two staff qualified with NASENCO and are currently working with CYPES/UK towards being Inclusion Champions. Our 2025 SIP is to have achieved the National ADHD schools accreditation by the end of the school year.
