Jersey Premium is a targeted funding programme for schools which has been introduced to help all children get the very best from their education. There are three eligibility criteria:

1. All pupils who are 'Looked After Children';
2. Children from households which have claimed Income Support for a total of 12 months or more within the last five years;
3. Children from households with 'Registered' status that would qualify to claim Income Support if they had lived in Jersey for five years.

If you think your family would qualify for Income Support if you had lived in the Island for five years, you can find out if your child is eligible for Jersey Premium by completing a short questionnaire. This is available from school and the Education Department. If you think that you may be eligible for additional Jersey Premium funding for your child, please read the information leaflets at this link:
