Guidance from Public Health

We have sought guidance on the 48 hour rule following sickness and diarrhoea as clarification. 'Guidance on Infection Control in Schools' remains at 48 hours. Whilst we appreciate that some children may vomit as a "one off" maybe if they have become over excited or eaten too quickly, generally speaking, diarrhoea and/or vomiting presents with other symptoms, including stomach cramps, temperature or general malaise. Please be aware of these symptoms and use your judgement when deciding whether your child should be at school.
