## Next week in Year 2...

### Maths:

Next week we will be focusing on subtraction, children will learn how to subtract ones from a 2-digit number without renaming.

### English:

**Literacy:** We are continuing using The Day The Crayons Quit to learn about letter writing. Children will learn how to plan their own letters and write them next week.

### Home Learning Activities:

Homework is set on a Wednesday and due in the Tuesday of the following week. This week's tasks are:

- **Spellings** - please can all children practise their spellings. These have been stuck into their orange homework books. Spellings will be tested on **Tuesday**.
- **Reading:** the children are encouraged to change their reading books from the home reader boxes in the classroom whenever they need to. They may need a gentle reminder on occasion and we will continue to do this each morning. Please continue read with your child for 15 minutes each night and record this in their reading diary. Thank you.
- **Maths:** the maths homework sheet has been stuck into your child's homework book; please ensure this is completed for Tuesday next week
