Next week in Year 2...

Maths:

Next week we will be focusing on addition, children will recap and learn how to add a 2-digit number and ones, without renaming.

English:

Literacy: This week we are starting our Text Driver 'The Day the Crayons Quit'. We will be looking at predicting skills, reading skills and asking and answering questions about the text.

Home Learning Activities:

Homework is set on a Wednesday and due in the Tuesday of the following week. This week's tasks are:

- **Spellings** - please can all children practise their spellings. These have been stuck into their orange homework books. Spellings will be tested on **Tuesday**.
