Next week in Reception

Maths:

We will spend the week revisiting any number concepts introduced such as counting/ordering numbers to 20, one more and one less, counting on and back using our fingers.

Literacy:

This week we will be focusing further on our 'Helicopter Stories'. A technique where we ask children to be the story tellers and then every child takes a turn in acting out their friend's story. Through doing this we are developing the children's confidence and vocabulary in telling stories, the saying goes 'if they can't say it, they can't write it!'.
