Next week in Year 1...

Maths:

We will continue working on addition stories during our maths lessons. We look at pictures of everyday situations and objects and make up addition stories for this. For example, 5 children are on the bike, 6 children are on the tarmac. There are 11 children altogether. So $5 + 6 = 11$



English:

We have now finished our work on 'Weather'. The children have loved this topic and particularly being 'weather reporters' in the role play area. We have written our weather reports as our final piece of work.

Home Learning

Maths for homework this week 😊

Use the number line to work out the addition sums. The children have learnt this at school and just need some extra practise. Please don't be alarmed if your child finds this too easy/hard- at home children should be practising the skill that they have been learning. They will use this skill with higher numbers as the year goes on so just need to ensure they understand the skill of moving up a number line to add. Equally, if your child is finding it particularly challenging, please try and catch me at the gate to have a quick chat (Homework is supposed to be a way of showing you what we are doing at school and not a task that we want your or your child worrying about).

Please also continue playing games with your child's phonics pack. If your child would like to do any extra maths work or writing (not compulsory), please use a separate piece of paper and then just pop it into their book so I can see it when their book returns on Tuesday.

Please remember your child's home learning book every Tuesday so homework books can be checked and reissued on Wednesday.

Please continue to read with your child for five minutes daily. Please then fill in the reading record to let us know how they are getting on.

Please come and see me if you have any questions at all regarding any of the homework. Your support is greatly appreciated.
