### Maths

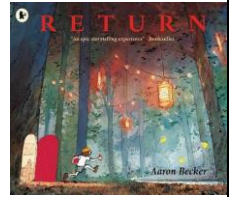
In Maths, we will be moving onto forms of Division.

This will be looking at dividing by 10, 100, 1000. While also exploring more formal methods of division.

### English

**Writing:** Next week children will be using our class book, 'Return' as the stimulus to write a story narrative. Applying their skills building tension and using direct speech.

**Reading:** Our reading sessions are still being rotated in groups from vocabulary, comprehension, grammar and group reading with an adult. Reading assessments results are available to children from Friday if they wish to know their scores.

#### Maths task:
